HOW TO STUDY GOD'S WORD DAILY PLAN

DAY ONE:

- 1. Pray and invite the Holy Spirit to come and guide you in your time with the Lord. Read through the passage of scripture thoughtfully.
- 2. Read again and circle all personal pronouns.
- 3. Read again and underline all verbs, especially action words.
- 4. Read once again and put a square around any adjectives.
- 5. Read it again and **highlight any words that stand out to you**. These are words you will research some more later.
- 6. End your time with the Lord by journaling anything that has stood out to you or you feel the Lord is speaking to your heart.

DAY TWO:

- 1. Pray and invite the Holy Spirit.
- 2. Read through the passage again taking note of all you circled, underline, put a square around and highlighted. Then write down any instruction that is being given and any promises of God.
- 3. Write about any specific instruction that stands out to you personally as well as any blessings that speak to you personally.
- 4. Make a list of the words highlighted. You'll need a dictionary, bible dictionary and concordance to being studying these tomorrow. If you don't own these, you can find these tools online and even apps.
- 5. Be still. Quiet your mind and listen for the small still voice of the Holy Spirit. Take time to do this every day. Write down anything you feel the Lord may be speaking to you.

DAY THREE:

- 1. Pray and invite the Holy Spirit.
- 2. Read through the passage again.
- 3. Study the words you wrote down, writing your findings down. Include anything the Holy Spirit is speaking to you.
- 4. Be still. Quiet your mind and listen for the small still voice of the Holy Spirit. Write down anything you feel the Lord may be speaking to you.

DAY FOUR:

- 1. Pray and invite the Holy Spirit.
- 2. Read through the passage again.
- 3. Write down any verses in the Bible that relate to your findings yesterday and write them down. If no verses come to mind, you can look up that particular word in the concordance and it will direct you to verses speaking about that topic.
- 4. Write out any verses that stand out to you or speak to you personally.
- 5. Be still. Quiet your mind and listen for the small still voice of the Holy Spirit. Write down anything you feel the Lord may be speaking to you.

DAY FIVE:

Romans 8

- 1. Pray and invite the Holy Spirit.
- 2. Read through the passage again.
- 3. Read the passage once again. Look over your findings.
- 4. Take some time to just soak in what you've learned and listen to hear what the Holy Spirit is saying. Journal what you feel the Lord is saying to you.
- 5. Be still. Quiet your mind and listen for the small still voice of the Holy Spirit. Write down anything you feel the Lord may be speaking to you.
